Desert	DEZZ-urt	An area that receives very low participation and supports few life forms.	From Latin words meaning abandoned or foresaken. First recorded in the C13th.
Dessert	Di-ZURT	A sweet course at the end of a meal.	From a French word meaning clear the table. First used in the 1600s.
Desert	Di-ZURT	A reward or punishment that is deserved.	From a French word meaning deserve. First used in the C13th.
Desert	Di-ZURT	To leave with no intention of returning.	From a Latin word meaning abandon.
