

SIMPLE SENTENCES

DECLARATIVE

Makes a statement and ends with a full-stop.

That dog with the black dots is called a Dalmatian.

INTERROGATIVE

Asks something and ends with a question mark.

IMPERATIVE

Gives a command and ends with a full-stop.

Will you be joining us for dinner?

EXCLAMATORY

Shouts of something and ends with an exclamation point.

Wow, that was a great day at the water park!

Feed my cat.

DIALOGUE

Written conversation shown within quotation marks.

"I am so excited about going to school today", said Sally
