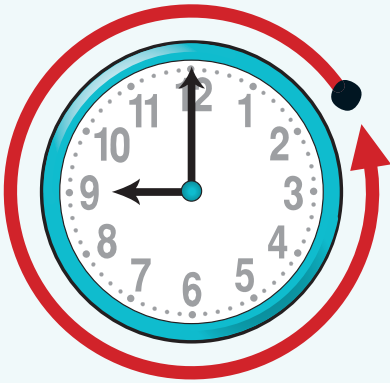




## Back Flip Lines

Back Flip Lines go around in a loop in the opposite direction to the hands on a clock.

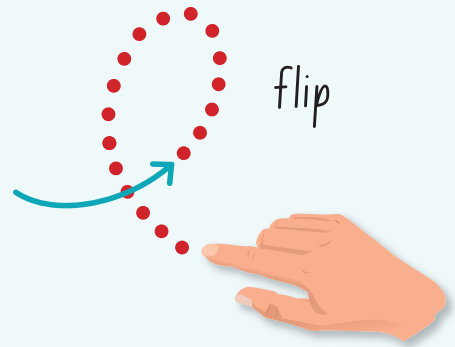
Anticlockwise



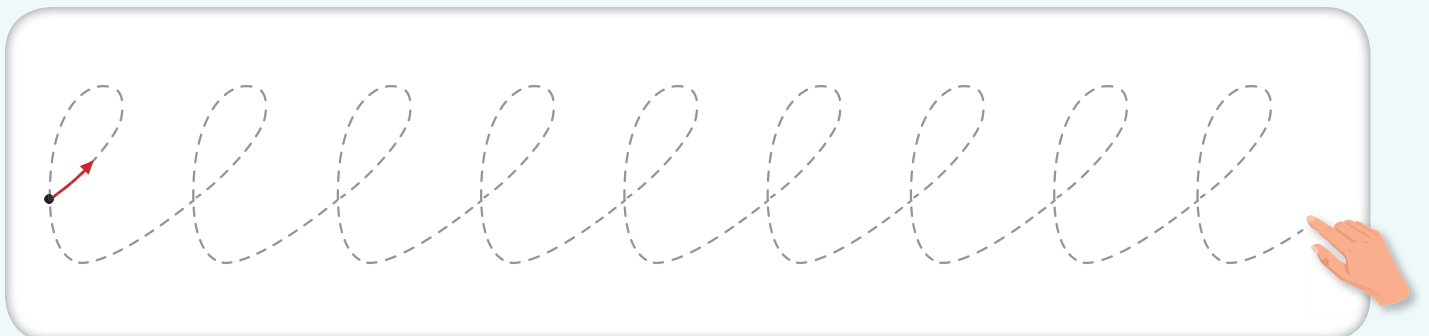
## The Back Flip Song

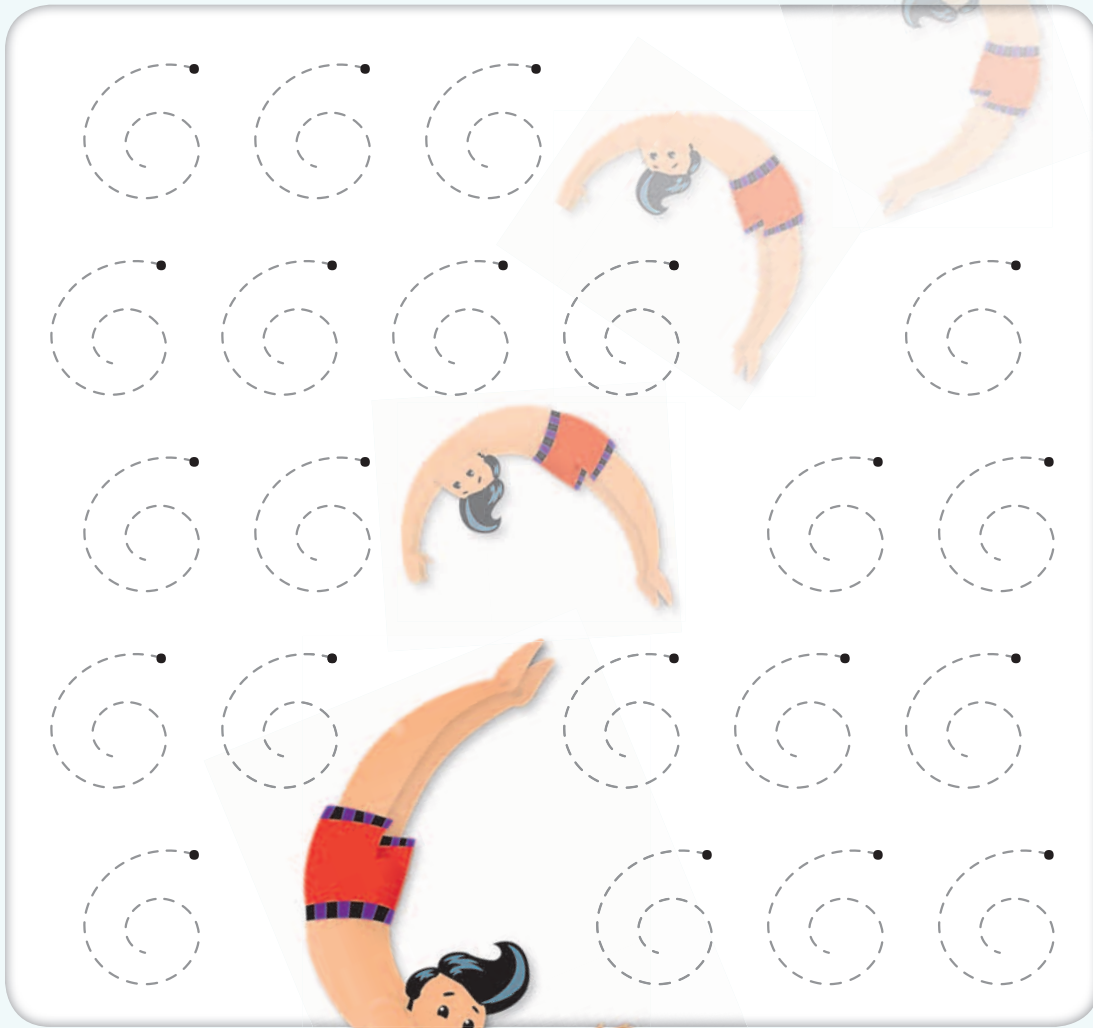
(Sing to the tune of The Wheels on the Bus)

On each "flip", draw a Back Flip Line in the air with your finger.



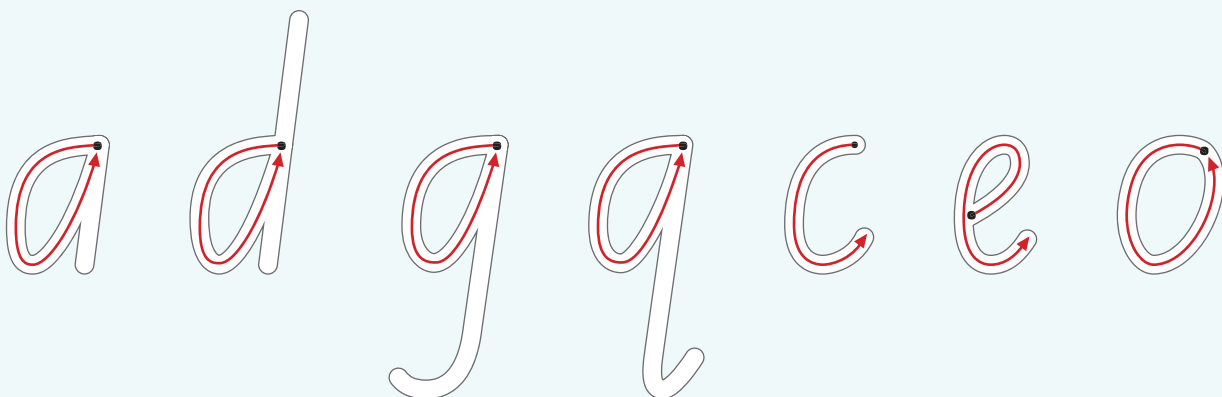


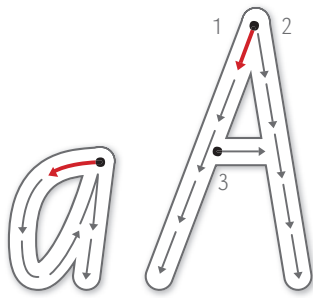
## Back Flip Letters

Sometimes you use the full Back Flip Line - like in the letter *a* - and sometimes you only use part of the Back Flip, like in *c*.

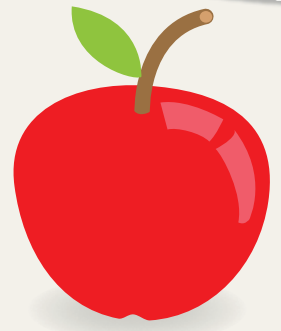
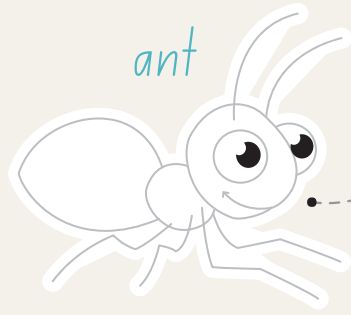

The letter a has a Back Flip Line and a Rainy Day Line.



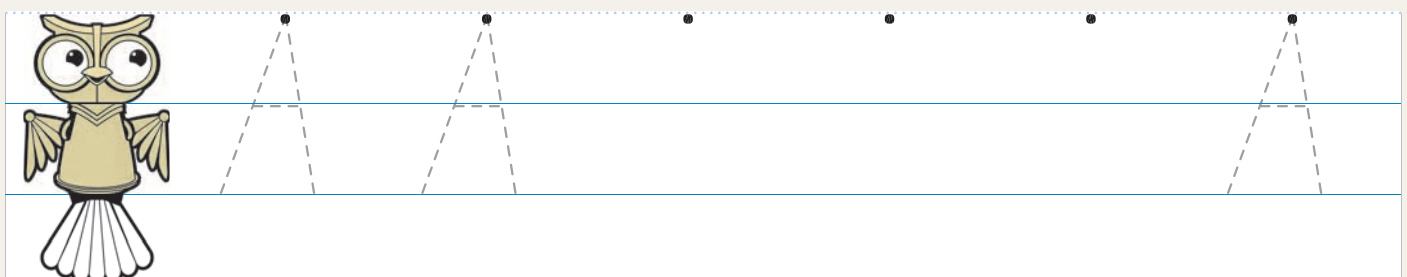
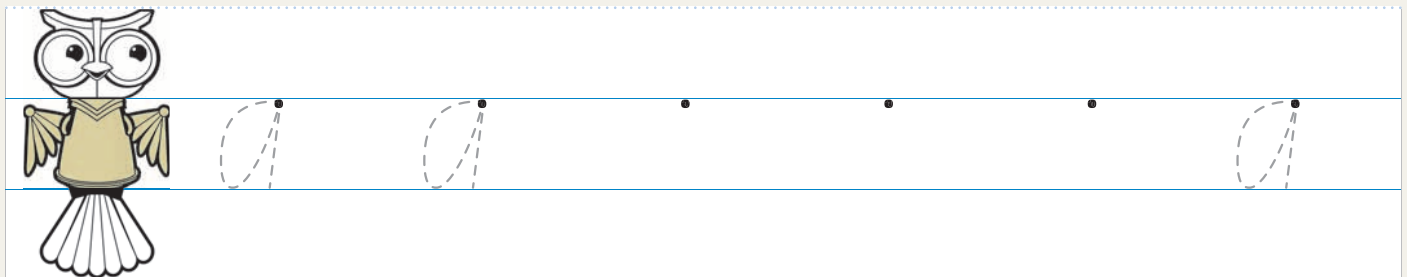
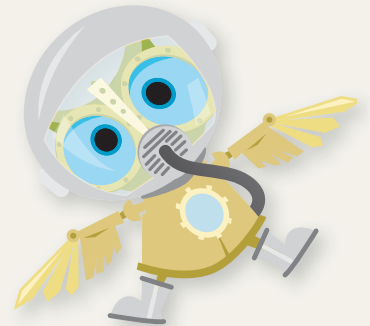


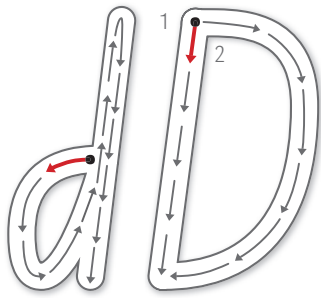

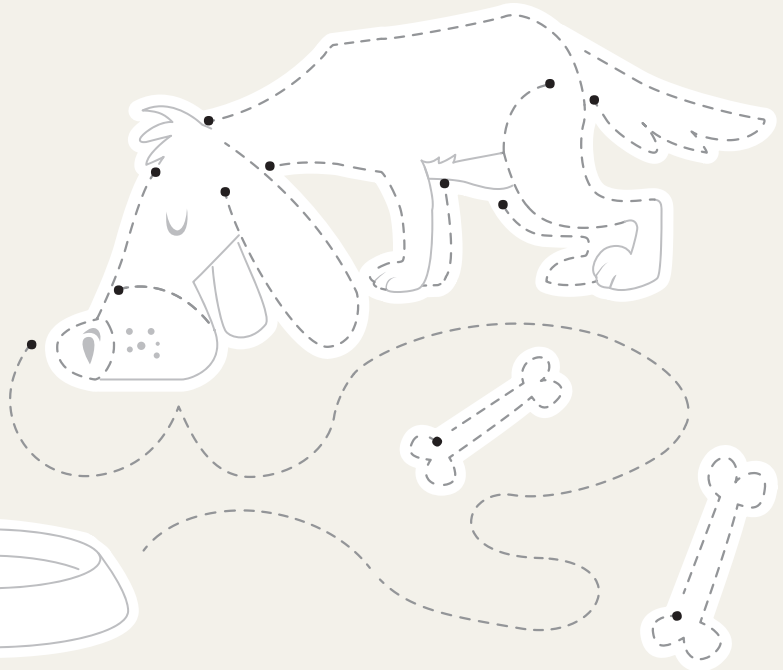




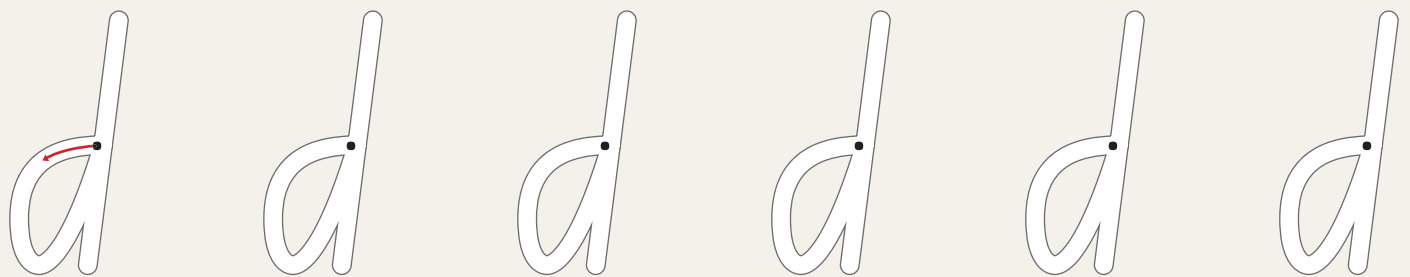
The letter d has a Back Flip Line and a tall Rainy Day Line.

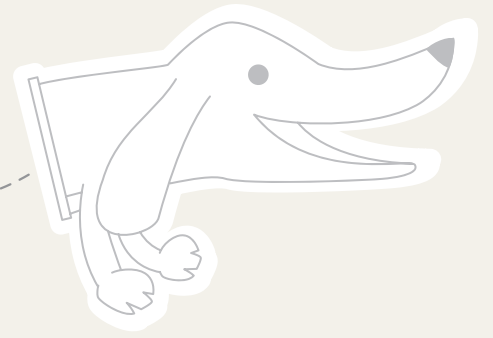

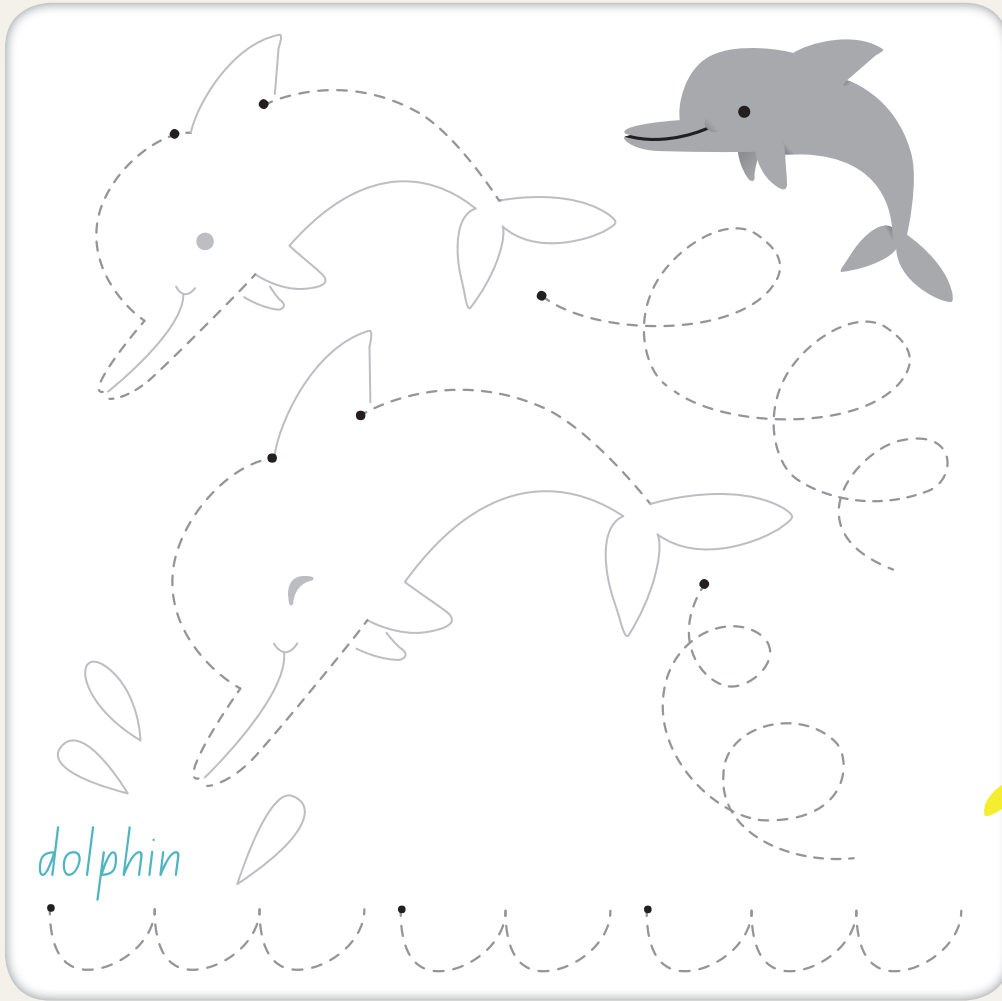
